In order to support the implementation of these objectives, the Group has adopted SA8000 for guidance in the social accountability aspects of its business.

This policy shall be communicated to every employee and be available to all other interested parties. This policy will be formally reviewed as part of the Group's management system. Any changes will be approved and communicated by the Group HR Director.
